- 3. All entries must be prepared by the Exhibitor and completed within 1 year prior to the opening of the Fair.

- 5. Projects made as a school assignment should be entered in Open Youth Divisions.
- 6. Projects made on your own exhibiting skills learned in a project must be entered in 4-H/Grange as evidence of extended learning.
- 7. Display of work should represent standard display procedures learned within a project.
- 8. Only one version of a photograph may be entered for evaluation.
- 9. Premiums will be awarded in Junior, Intermediate and Advanced areas only.

DEPARTMENT AWARDS

1. The Danish System of Judging will be used. This system of judging is based upon established standards of quality for each type of product. In this system each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets the standard rather than how it compares to other exhibits. Judges shall use the following guidelines:

 92% - 100%
 White - Average
 70% - 83%

 Red – Good
 84% - 91%
 No Award - Poor
 69% or less

2. Premiums awarded in Junior, Intermediate and Advanced Divisions will be:

Best of Class \$10.00 Best of Division \$20.00

- 3. All Blue-Ribbon winners will be considered for Best of Class. There must be at least three entries in a Class for Best of Class to be awarded. However, if a Judge advocates for an exemplary exhibit it may be considered for the Best of Class rosette regardless of the number of entries in the Class.
- 4. Best of Class Winners will be considered for Best of Division.
- 5. Best of Division will be considered for Best of Show Award. One award can be presented in each age group.
- 6. Table settings are a <u>non-premium</u> competition. Ribbons will be awarded.
- 7. Sweepstakes Award will be presented to the outstanding Exhibitor with the highest cumulative points overall. Points will be awarded as follows:

Best of Division = 3 points Best of Class = 2 points Blue Ribbon = 1 point

- 8. Fair Theme Award theme "Fair-Ever Young 150 Years of Fun" will be awarded in the following Divisions: Art/Crafts, Fine Arts, Photography, Primary and Grange Youth. Ribbons will be awarded.
- 9. No points will be awarded for Red or White Ribbons. One overall Sweepstakes Award will be presented.

PHOTOGRAPHY

PHOTOGRAPHY ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED. JUDGED AND DISPLAYED IN THE PHOTOGRAPHY BUILDING

Rules:

- 1. The following MUST be on the back of each print: An arrow at the center top of the mounting board indicating the direction of the photograph. Division, Class, title, where taken, Exhibitor's name, city, and telephone number. The name of the exhibitor must not appear on the front of the print, but in the top middle on the back.
- 2. Photos must be firmly mounted on a black or white foam core (¼" thick). All photos must be mounted flush to the edges of the foam core. NO BORDERS. Front matte boards, or colored foam core are allowed.
- 3. Do not use picture frames, glass or hanging devices.

- 4. Place a 3/4 inch square of non-commercial weight Velcro on the back top corners of the foam core (hook side up)
- 5. Photographs taken prior to August 1, 2023, are not eligible.
- 6. Only one version of a photograph may be submitted for evaluation.
- 7. Digitally enhanced photographs must include the program used on the back of the photograph.
- 8. Minimum size 5" x7", Maximum size 11" x 14". Youth 1 and 2 mounted snapshots will be accepted. NO BORDERS.
- 9. Mounting: Dry mount or use acid free two-sided tape. Do Not use masking tape or transparent adhesive that does not work well in humidity. Make sure that prints are firmly attached to the board.

Open jars not picked up will be discarded.

- 2. Entry and label must list the type of produce (i.e., peaches, pears, etc.), and the method and process used. Low acid foods must be canned under pressure. No paraffin seals. All canning exhibits must be in sealed jars.
